What you will be doing

Reporting to the Physiotherapy Managers you will work as part of a team of Physiotherapists and Physiotherapy Assistants as part of a wider Multi-Disciplinary Team consisting of Speech and Language Therapists, Occupational Therapists and educational professionals.

You will as part of the Physiotherapy team:

- Hold clinical responsibility for a caseload of academic learners and private clients.
- Undertake assessment of individuals with complex pathologies and communication difficulties.
- Treat learners individually or in a group, in accordance with treatment protocols
- Encourage learners to partake in an active approach to regaining and maintaining independence. This requires empathy, sensitivity and exceptional interpersonal skills.
- Use effective and appropriate communication skills, to assist with treatment programmes. Especially for learners who may have difficulty understanding exercises etc.
- Undertake treatments utilising a variety of modalities including gym work, exercise prescription, use of trampoline, aquatic physiotherapy, virtual reality and classroom-based interventions.
- Work without direct supervision.
- Set SMART goals for treatment periods, review progress and modify goals and treatments as required.
- Be constantly striving for the best level of physiotherapy support for the people we work with.



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- Instruct students, carers, tutors, learning support assistants and personal assistants on mobility and physical therapy activities and demonstrate the safe use of equipment.
- Work within own scope of practice.
- Make accurate records of work undertaken and keep accurate activity records, in line with CSP and departmental guidelines.
- To liaise with internal and external professionals and services when necessary regarding student care, highlighting any variations to expected outcomes.
- Complete written reports and correspondence as required to a high standard.
- To attend any 'in-service' training provided and actively participate in the delivery.
- Hold supervision responsibility for Physiotherapy assistants.
- Training newly appointed staff in elements of student care, safety and induction into the department.
- Contribute to student care and promote cross College working, by attending relevant team and departmental meetings.
- Gather initial information regarding the students from medical notes, databases, handovers, MDT meetings, as required.
- Assist other physiotherapists in the delivery of their caseload.
- Carry out safe moving and handling practice, for moderately to severely dependent clients within the College, on a daily basis. In accordance with planned programmes of care and moving and handling guidelines
