- Ensure best practice approaches to learners transitioning into and out of the provision, completion of Person-Centred Reviews and independence related workshops and guidance and parent/carer
- Working collaboratively with a multi-disciplinary team, including therapists (PBS, SLT, OT, PT), and learning mentors, to ensure wraparound support for each learner.
- Liaising with families, caregivers, and professionals to maintain a consistent and cohesive support network
- Guiding and supporting subject tutors to embed nurturing, inclusive, and therapeutic teaching practices, ensuring that learners are emotionally supported while developing key life skills.
- Delivering individual and group tutorials, focusing on emotional resilience, self-regulation, and advocacy, while providing intervention where learners are struggling to progress.
