Welcome to your spring edition of our newsletter which showcases some of the highlights of last term.

Last term was another busy one with lots of exciting developments and successes.

We've launched a brand-new Assessment Service, where people aged 13+ can access private neurodiversity pre-diagnostic screening and autism and ADHD assessments at competitive prices and without the lengthy waiting lists of the NHS.

Following the success of our new Forest Road West provision in Nottingham, we have accelerated our plans to continue growing in the city, and are in the process of purchasing another site where we will deliver specialist FE programmes from September for learners with complex needs.



We welcomed Ofsted for a 4-day visit to help them test out their new inspection framework. Although this wasn't a formal inspection, our Further Education team did us proud, showcasing our Outstanding provision and giving valuable feedback on the new framework which is being rolled out across the sector.

Our Pines residential development is on track for completion ready for its first residents in September.

Our annual Spring Fair returns on Sunday 18th May, this is a great day for all the family, and this year, we're excited to announce a special flypast from the RAF BBMF Lancaster.

I hope you enjoy reading the many wonderful examples of how our learners, citizens, volunteers and staff continue to shine.

Using our dedicated staff member's vast knowledge and skill in the area, plus her brand

new ADOS-2 and ADI-R qualification and access to a Clinical Psychologist, the service will be able to provide a clear,

compassionate assessment to give clients the answers, support and resources they need within just 13 weeks of first contact. A huge reduction in time compared to the traditional route of assessments.

Costs are fixed and at a very competitive price of just

£2,000, and a basic Neurodiversity Screening if you don't want a full assessment is just £350.
